

URBANALLIANCE PROGRAM EVALUATION DCPS Parental Consent (For Youth Ages 17 and Under)

PURPOSE OF THE EVALUATION

An evaluation of the Urban Alliance High School Internship Program is being conducted by the Urban Institute through a grant from the U.S. Department of Education. The purpose of this evaluation is to assess the impact of the internship program on the educational attainment, employment, and life experiences of participants. Your child is one of approximately 1,800 individuals being asked to participate.

STUDY PROCEDURES

If you agree to have your child participate in the study, your child will be asked to complete two 30-40 minute surveys via telephone or web approximately one year and two and a half years after high school graduation. The question topics include his/her experience preparing for college and work life, educational attainment, employment experience, behaviors, outlook, and other areas. For each survey that he/she complete he/she will receive \$50 as a token of appreciation. The surveys are voluntary—your child can refuse to answer any questions or stop being part of the study at any time without any negative consequences—but his/her participation will help us learn important information about how programs like Urban Alliance can help students like you. Your child will be contacted by a survey firm via telephone, email, or text message when it is time to complete a survey.

Additionally, the Urban Institute will obtain your child's high school educational records from your school district including eligibility for free or reduced price lunch; English Language Learner and Special Education statuses; dates of attendance; previous high schools attended; withdrawal date and reason; absences, suspensions, and GPA by year as well as cumulative GPA; and class rank. These records will cover all years of high school attendance in your child's current city. They will be used to determine the program's effect on academic outcomes. Furthermore, the Urban Institute will obtain your child's wage and employment data from your state's Unemployment Insurance wage and employment records and credit score and loan debt data from one of the three major credit bureaus. The Unemployment Insurance data provided will be used only for this evaluation to help determine the program's effect on wages and employment outcomes. Participants in this evaluation who complete surveys will be compensated.

Urban Alliance will obtain your child's college attendance records from the National Student Clearinghouse and share them with the Urban Institute, and will also share data on his/her internship program participation, including internship wages and hours worked.

RANDOM ASSIGNMENT

We will use a random assignment procedure (like a lottery) to place your child in the study's "program group," which can enter the internship program, or its "comparison group," which cannot enter. If your child does not participate in the study, he/she will still be randomly assigned to the program. All applicants have the same chance of entering the program, whether or not they participate in the study.

PRIVACY

All responses will be kept private by researchers. Information such as name and address will be stored separately from survey responses, credit and wage/employment data, and educational records. Your child's data will be aggregated with that of other study participants and he/she will not be identifiable in any published research findings. Within one year of the study's completion, the evaluators will destroy any personal identifying information by permanently erasing your electronic records.

RISKS AND BENEFITS

Your child may find some of the questions in the surveys to be personal. He/she may refuse to answer any question and may take a break at any time during a survey. For each survey that your child completes, **he/she will receive \$50** as a token of appreciation. This evaluation may also generate support for government policies that offer resources to communities such as yours for investment in youth.

WHY AN EVALUATION?

The Urban Institute is doing an evaluation of the Urban Alliance High School Internship Program through a grant from the U.S. Department of Education. Through this evaluation we hope to find out how the internship program affects whether you graduate high school, go to college, and get a good paying job. You are one of about 1,800 high school students being asked to join.

ABOUT THE EVALUATION

If you agree to be in the evaluation, you will be asked to complete two 30-40 minute surveys on the phone or on a website, about a year after you graduate high school and again about a year and a half after that. The survey questions will be about your experience preparing for college and work life, whether you went to college, the jobs you have worked, your outlook on life, and other areas. For each survey you complete you will get \$50. You do not have to do the surveys—you can refuse to answer any questions or stop being part of the study at any time with no consequences—but if you participate you will help us learn important information about how programs like Urban Alliance can help students like you. You will be contacted by a survey firm by phone, email, or text message when it is time to complete a survey.

The Urban Institute will collect your high school educational records from your school district including your eligibility for free school lunch; whether English is your first language; whether you're in any Special Education classes; when you attended; other high schools you attended; when you left school for good and why; how often you were suspended or absent each year; your GPA by year and for all years combined; and your class rank. These records will cover all years you were in high school in your current city. They will be used to find out the program's effect on how well you do in school. The Urban Institute will also collect a history of the places you have worked and the wages you have earned from your state's Unemployment Insurance wage and employment records and your credit score and history of loans you have taken out from one of the three major credit bureaus. The Unemployment Insurance data will be used only for this evaluation to find out how the program affects the jobs you get and the wages you earn. Participants in this evaluation who complete surveys will be compensated.

Urban Alliance will collect records of your college attendance from the National Student Clearinghouse and share them with the Urban Institute. Urban Alliance will also share information on your internship program participation, including how much you earned at your internship and the hours you worked.

LOTTERY

We will use a lottery to place you in one of two groups. One group will be allowed to join the internship program and the other group will not be allowed. If you don't participate in the study, you will still have to go through the lottery. Everyone has the same chance of entering the program, whether or not they participate in the study.

PRIVACY

All your answers will be kept private by researchers. Information like your name and address will be kept separate from your survey responses, credit and wage/employment information, and educational records. Your information will be lumped together with that of other students and no one will be able to tell you are in the evaluation from reading one of the research reports. A year after the study is over, the researchers will destroy any personal information like your name and address by permanently erasing your electronic records.

RISKS AND BENEFITS

Some of the questions in the surveys might seem personal to you. You can refuse to answer any question and you may take a break at any time during a survey. For each survey that you complete, **you will receive \$50**. This evaluation also could make the government want to spend more money on programs that help communities like yours and students like you.
